VILLAGE OF NORWOOD MEETING OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN REGULAR SESSION December 12, 2022

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen met in regular session at the Norwood Town Hall on Monday, December 12, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Becky Bellue presiding. Aldermen Tyler Glascock and Kimmi Sellers were present. Alderman David Jett was absent.

All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted.

A motion was made by Ald. Sellers and seconded by Ald. Glascock approving the minutes of the November meeting.

A motion was made by Ald. Glascock and seconded by Ald. Sellers approving the financial statement for November, as well as payment of the new bills for December.

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. Police Report Chief Kenny Stewart gave the monthly report.
- 2. Fire Report Chief Jimmy Garig said that he was proud of Norwood for turning out in support of the fire tax renewal.
- 3. Gas Report Jimmy Garig reported that the gas usage has been up with the recent cold snap.
- 4. Maintenance Report Kohnke Rogillio reported that they've been cleaning up a ton of trash around town. We ask that people use the trash cans around town instead of throwing paper out along the roadway. Speed bumps and signage have been placed on each side of the wooden bridge on Thompson Creek Road at Shady Grove Lane. This is in an effort to slow people down, as the bridge is being damaged by speeding vehicles. Mayor Bellue said that she has been told that the bridge is on the list to be replaced in the next 3 years.
- 5. Clerk's Report Clerk Jennie Jelks reminded everyone to be working on their Ethics and Sexual Harassment classes, as this is the last month to get them done.

- 7. Bid Opening for Old Town Hall Building Morgan Improvements was the only bidder. Paul Holmes with LMA will check the bid and work on getting a contract signed.

- 3. Citizen's Participation Mike Tumey asked for an update on the money that's been discussed for Thompson Creek Road. There was no update. We are at the mercy of the grantors. He also asked that the ditches be cleaned on Thompson Creek Road, as the water runs across the road in certain spots. Mayor Bellue said that she would check on that.
